As part of a new curriculum from the University of Florida/IFAS Extension, students across the state are learning about Florida's early cattle ranching traditions by reading Patrick Smith's classic novel *A Land Remembered*. The students will then watch real cowboys move cattle across the landscape while exploring wildlife, ranch life, and land stewardship in action during a week of special shows direct from the trail.

We're offering you a front-row seat in the saddle during the livestream launch on January 26—enjoy craft activities and free snacks while learning about Florida's working lands, wild spaces, and the food they provide.
